

Calvary Christian School Admissions Policies

1. To enroll in K/4 or K/5 a child must be four or five by August 31st of that school year.
2. The parents of all incoming students will need to call the school office to schedule an entrance interview. A recent report card, achievement test results, and available documentation regarding special needs should be brought to the interview. Students are accepted on the basis of the interview, entrance testing, current achievement test results, recent school grades, discipline records, references (7-12th), and space availability.
3. By enrolling a child at CCS, parents enter into a spiritual, educational and financial commitment with the school. Upon enrolling a child, parents sign a statement of cooperation pledging that they will cooperate with and not in any way oppose the school's purpose, philosophy, policies, procedures & regulations. Parents should therefore fully and comprehensively read the CCS handbook and make a thorough investigation of the school to insure that they are fully supportive of its direction and philosophy.
4. Calvary admits students of any race, color, or national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. CCS does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, or national and ethnic origin in the administration of its educational or admissions policies, scholarship programs, and athletic programs, as well as other school-administered programs. Family life, church status, and general behavior are carefully considered.
5. Calvary is not equipped to handle children with serious learning disabilities, who are seriously deficient academically, or who manifest consistent behavior problems. For children with less serious learning difficulties, CCS utilizes several award winning intervention programs that often enable a child who is deficient to gain skills needed for success. CCS will not accept students whose needs we determine we are not equipped to meet.
6. CCS does not typically admit students in 8th grade and above who are not transferring from a Christian school. Exceptions to this rule can only be made by joint approval of both pastor and principal. Home-schooled children transferring to CCS are considered on an individual basis.
7. For students entering 7th-12 grades:
 - 7th - 12th grades:
 - ➔ Student referral forms must be completed by the student's pastor, a former teacher, and another adult.
 - ➔ A family referral form must be completed by the pastor of the church they regularly attend.
 - 7th- 8th grades:
 - ➔ At least one parent must have received Christ as personal Savior.
 - ➔ The student and at least one parent must faithfully attend church.
 - 9th- 12th grades:
 - ➔ At least one parent must have received Christ as personal Savior.
 - ➔ All 9th - 12th students must have received Jesus Christ as personal Savior.
 - ➔ The student and at least one parent must be faithfully attending members of a church that is in harmony with Calvary's Statement of Faith.
 - ➔ Students who are or have been married, who are or have been pregnant, or who are or have been sexually active, will not be considered for enrollment at CCS.
 - ➔ Students finishing 9th - 11th grades return for another year by special invitation only, providing that attitude, behavior, and spiritual direction are in harmony with the goals of Calvary Christian School.
